BCWD awards the Installation of Pumping Facilities for One (1) Production Well at Barangay Tabon to GS Ferrolino Construction & Supply

The Bislig City Water District (BCWD) thru its Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) has awarded the installation of Pumping facilities for one (1) Production Well at Barangay Tabon, Bislig City to GS Ferrolino Construction and Supply, a Kidapawan City based construction enterprise last March 2, 2016 at the BCWD Office, Mangagoy, Bislig City.

The project includes the delivery,

installation of electromechanical facilities-40 HP Submersible Pump and Motor with 6" column/ riser pipe, submersible cable, Variable Frequency Device (VFD), and Soft Starter Controller and to 6" Discharge Line comprises of check valves, pressure gauges, air release valves, bypass pipe and other appurtenances to complete the discharge line. Complete facilities for Gas Chlorination System including

booster pump, 8" Distribution and Transmission Pipe, painting works, excavation of trench, pipe supports, control house, testing, commissioning and some appurtenances specified and shown in the drawings to complete the project.

installation of **Pumping** facilities for one (1) Production Well at Barangay Tabon, Bislig City is part of the Engineering Department's CAPEX projects for the Calendar Year (CY) 2016 with project duration of 80 calendar days and with a total amount of Php.3,386,705.63. The Tabon deep well project will be used as alternate water source whenever the Barangay San Antonio and Kauntuan water sources will be depleted. With the current installation and completion of the said facilities for the Tabon deep-well 1, thousands of concessionaires from Barangays Tabon and Mangagoy and even the concessionaires in Barangay Poblacion, Bislig City will be the one to benefit the said project.

The Civil Service Commission conducted a one-day Gender Sensitivity Seminar (GSS) last November 8, 2016 hosted by Lianga Water District held at Kansilad Beach Resort, Ganayon, Lianga, Surigao del Sur.

The Orientation Seminar attended by 32 participants who were General Manager, Administrative, Commercial, Operation/ Technical, and Finance officers and employees all Categories D Water Districts from Lianga and Tagbina.

Director Ruth Cabilogan- Beniga, MPSM, of Civil Service Commission - Surigao del Sur facilitated the seminar provided the participants with the fundamentals of Gender and Development (GAD) as articulated by Section 36(b) of RA 9710, otherwise known as the "Magna Carta of Women" mandates the creation and/ or strengthening of the Gender and Development (GAD) Focal Point System or similar GAD mechanism in all departments, including their attached agencies, offices, bureaus, state universities and colleges, government-owned and controlled corporations, local government unit, and other government instrumentalities to catalyzed and accelerate gender mainstreaming within the agency or LGU and the Philippine Commission on Women (PCW) issued Memorandum Circular No. 2011-01 dated October 21, 2011 which provided for guidelines for the creating, strengthening and institutionalization of Gender and Development (GAD) Focal Point System.

The main objectives of the seminar were: To develop



sensitivity in perceiving existing gender issues and inequalities, To recognize the differing situation and needs of women men and consider these in every action or decision they make, To deepen understanding on how and why women's rights and human rights, To introduce the participants and staff to each other, and To generate/ cull stereotyped images of women.

The scope of the seminars includes: Introduction to the seminar, Introduction to GAD, Pitik-Palak, Sex and Gender, Sapot ng Gagamba, MaSaLi, Ang Babae Sa Aking Buhay, and Ritual as Closing Ceremony.

Director Beniga distinguished the SEX as naturaldistinguishing variable based on biological attributes; physicalgenitalia, reproductive organs, genetic, chromosomes & hormones from GENDER for what masculinity and feminity socially determined, culturally defined which refers to the behavior.

It was indeed a fruitful seminar wherein the majority participants of men have greater knowledge especially in promoting the integration of women as full and equal partners of men in the development.

The Water Safety Plan (WSP) culminated by the World Health Organization (WHO) and water series of expert consultations on year 1956. The DOH Administrative Order No. 2014-0027 "National Policy on Water Safety Plan (WSP) for all Drinking-Water Service Providers". Local Water Utilities Administration (LWUA) as an administrative governing body of Water Districts also issued Memorandum Circular No. 010.14 in support to the implementation of DOH Administrative Order No. 2014-0027. Water Safety Plan (WSP) is the most effective means of consistently achieving the safety of a drinking-water supply. The application of an extensive risk assessment and risk management approach that encompasses all steps in water supply system from sources, production, storage and conveyance to consumers will ensure safety of drinking water supply.

Lianga Water District Human Resource Unit sends personnel for the crafting, development, and assessment of the WSP. They have undergone series of seminars which the output is the Water Safety Plan Manual to be submitted to LWUA for fine-tuning/ critiquing thereafter to DOH for approval. The seminars are as follows: WSP Orientation on April 21,-24, 2015 in Sun City Suites, General Santos City; WSP Development on September 29 – October 1, 2015 in Grand Regal Hotel, Km 7, Lanang, Davao City; WSP Orientation and Development on February 15-18, 2016 at Almont Beach Resort, Lipata, Surigao City; and WSP Development Training on November 10-11, 2016 at Kansilad Beach Resort, Lianga, Surigao del Sur.





In line with the agency's mission and vision, Madrid Water District continues to provide safe and potable drinking water to the community by reaching unserved and underserved areas in Madrid, Surigao del Sur through implementation of Non-LWUA Initiated Fund (NLIF) Water Supply Expansion Project.

This source of funds enabled Madrid WD to invest in a new well and extend pipelines, as well as the capacity to build a 100 cu. m. elevated steel tank reservoir for its concessionaires. The District was also able to buy a 20 kVa Generator Set, two (2) units chlorinator and two (2) units flow meter to provide water 24/7 to every household in the municipality.

As of this time, extension of pipelines to Barangays Panayogon and San Juan are on-going, to be followed by expansion to Barangays Patong-patong, Union and Songkit.

PROCUREMENT OF UPVC PIPES By: Rhazelle C. Yaranon

The Tagbina Water District (TWD) which was included in the NG 2014 funding through the Local Water Utilities Administration (LWUA) has conducted a competitive bidding for the procurement of the Unplasticized Polyvinyl Chloride (uPVC) pipes.

The LWUA held a Pre-Bid Conference last July 30, 2015, 10:00A.M. at the Bidding Room, G/F LWUA Bldg., Katipunan Road, Balara, Quezon City to clarify and/or explain any of the requirements, terms, conditions and specifications stipulated in the bidding documents as well as answering the queries of the prospective bidders. The submission of bids was also announced and was scheduled on August 13, 2015 to be followed by the Bid opening after the closing of bid submission on the same day.

Submission of bids and bid opening were postponed on



August 25, in pursuant to Sec. 12.3 "Quorum" of the Revised IRR of RA9148.

Out of seven (7) prospective bidders that downloaded the Invitation to Bid (ITB) from PhilGEPS, four (4) acquired bidding documents and three (3) submitted their bids. Two (3) bidders complied with all the requirements for bid submission and were rated "Passed". Goodyear Steel Pipe Corporation was declared the Bid Winner having the lowest calculated bid.



BIDDING FOR EXCAVATION AND BACKFILLING

The Department of Budget and Management (DBM) through Local Water Utilities Administration (LWUA) has granted the Tagbina Water District funds amounting to 15 Million Pesos for its Water Supply System Improvement Project.

In connection to this, the TWD conducted a public bidding for the Excavation and Backfilling of 12,912 linear meter trench for the proposed pipe laying of various uPVC pipes ranging from 50mm to 100mm.

The eligibility check and the evaluation of bids were conducted on May 30, 2016, by the Bids and Awards Committee of Lianga Water District and participated by the COA Representative Mr. Anbert Angelo C. Cayna, Kagawad Member Mr. Marcelino Mendez and TWD employees.

There were two (2) bidders who purchased the bid documents and submitted their bid proposal. The BAC declared the RDF Construction and Supply as the winner

having the lowest Bid Proposal.

The BAC recommended the TWD to issue the Notice of Award to RDF Construction and Supply and asked to post their Performance Security. To follow up, GM Ildefonso C. Albarracin personally visited the given address and called the telephone no. contained in the letter of intent but the address given can't be located and the Tel/Fax No. is not in service anymore.

Due to the failure of the RDF to submit and comply with the requirements, the TWD requested the BAC of Lianga to declare the bidding as failure.

The Tagbina Water District proceeded to the second bidding. The deadline of submission and the Opening of Bids were scheduled on August 30, 2016. There were two (2) interested bidders. After thorough evaluation, the BAC declared ROIM Builders and Construction Supply as the winning bidder.


TREE PLANTING ACTIVITY LAUNCHED BY TANDAG CITY WATER DISTRICT IN COMMEMORATION OF WORLD WATER DAY 2017 By: Gretchen N. Baghari

Water sustains life. Everyone has a right to water. Water is defined under Article 13 of the Water Code, as "the privilege granted by the government to appropriate use of water." These privileges were recognized by United Nations during its General Assembly in 1993 and March 22 was officially declared as World Water Day.

With these, the Tandag City Water District spearheaded the local Tree Planting activity on 31 March 2017, bringing the theme from the National "Water and Wastewater". The Provincial Environment and Natural Resources Office (PENRO) in line with their National Greening Program (NGP), headed by Forester Edgar S. Valentin and King Energy Generation Incorporated (KEGI) Power plant joined in celebrating the World Water Day.

The 67 employees of the District together with our partners started to hike going to Ihawan Spring Community Watershed and simultaneously planted trees beside the creek. A total of 300 native trees like narra and giant bamboo were planted during the gathering. These species are highly valued internationally for its toughness and strength.

In every tree planting activity of the District which is done annually, the goal is to bring back the original forest and protect the unique plants and animals that live in the 786 hectare community watershed. By bringing it back to its original form, watershed is preserved and protected which means we are also bringing back the abundant supply of water that can be sourced out from there.

Do you know that about 20 earthquakes are recorded daily in the Philippines? Most of these earthquake however, are unfelt and can only be detected by an instrument called seismograppa. Earthquakes cannot be prepared, but we can prepare for them.

Always remember these busic things to do before, during and after a strong earthquake:

BEFORE

The key to effective disaster prevention is planning:



- ✓ Know the certifiquake hazards in your area.
- Follow structural design and engineering practices shes constructing a house or building.
- Evaluate the structural soundness of the huildings and bouses; strengthen or retrofit if necessary.

Prepare your homes, workplace or schools:

- Strap or holt heavy fluritures/cabinets to the walls.
- Check the stability of langing objects like ceiling fins and chindeliers.
- Breakable Berns, harmful chemicals and flammable materials should be stored properly in the lowermost secured shelves.
- Always turn off the gas tanks when not in use.



Familiarias sourceif with the exit mates and places where fire estinguishers, first aid kits, alarms, and communication facilities are located. Learn how to use them beforehand.

Prepare a handy emergency supply kit with first aid kit, cannot food and can opener, water, clothing, blanket, futters-operated radio, floolights and extra latteries.

When you are INSIDE a structurally sound building or home...STAY THERE!
